October 6, 2018

Meeting called to order at 1800 by Vice Commander Mike Ciesielko in absence of Base Commander Ralph Rohrssen. Attending were Board of Directors members Bill Freligh, Joe Lunn, Larry Knutson, Rick Sparger, Carl Chinn, Harry Nettles, Nick Nichols, Ken Hutchison, Tom Lawson, Rick Wise, George Scharf, Gordon Long, and Gordon Williams.

Vice Commander – Mike Ciesielko:

 Mike Discussed American Submariner boat sponsorship program which is promoted by national USSVI. These are subscriptions to be sent to submarines. The subscriptions can also be sent to the ROTCs. Ken Hutchison made a motion to sponsor the local Navy ROTCs and JROTCs but after some discussion, the motion was seconded by Nick and modified for Charleston Base to sponsor the USS Greeneville SSN-772, USS Columbia SSN-771 and the Citadel NROTC. Most board members showed hands in favor. There was, however, no dissenting vote expressed.

Holland Club – Bill Freligh:

• There will be no Holland Club in October. The next Holland Club induction will be in April.

COB – Joe Lunn:

- Renewed discussion of increasing membership. He wears his hat to get attention. Suggestions offered by others were billboards, meeting notices in the paper, actual advertisements with pictures of submarine dolphins etc...
