USS Shark (SS-174) Shark was the 1st US submarine sunk by enemy surface craft in the Pacific

After having transported Admiral Hart and other officials from Manila to Surabaya on her first patrol, SHARK, commanded by Lt. Cdr. L. Shane, Jr. departed on 5 January 1942 for her second war patrol. She saw a torpedo, fired at her by an enemy submarine on 6 January, miss.

In anticipation of a possible enemy attack at Ambon Island, ComSubsAsiatic told SHARK to contact Dutch submarines at the harbor entrance of that island. On 25 January, SHARK was advised that heavy air raids on Ambon might indicate that an enemy landing force was moving toward the island.

Two days later SHARK was ordered to take station as part of a submarine group performing reconnaissance of a major enemy move south through Molukka passage. On 29 January, because another move toward Ambon was indicated, SHARK was ordered to cover the passage to the east of Lifometola. The next day this was enlarged to include the area to Banka Passage. On 2 February SHARK reported to Surabaya that she had been depth charged 10 miles off Tifore Island and that she had missed on one torpedo attack. Five days later SHARK reported an empty enemy cargo ship heading northeast. In answer to these messages, Surabaya pointed out that such transmissions contained little information of use in appraising the situation, and that they might very possibly reveal to the enemy a position to avoid. No further messages were received from SHARK.

She was told on 8 February to proceed to Makassar Strait via the north coast of Celebes, and later was told to report information. Nothing further was heard from SHARK and on 7 March she was reported as presumed lost.



The other thing I want to note is if you are signed up to login and handle your DFAS myPay online then you need to be sure that info is included in your important papers for your family after your passing.

The time surrounding the death of a loved one is a difficult period in anyone's life. In addition to grief, the time is full of uncertainties and change. At DFAS Retired & Annuitant Pay, we realize that the status of pay and entitlements is one of those areas of uncertainty. Thanks for your feedback and ideas, we've made some improvements to help smooth the process for survivors and beneficiaries. We are pleased to announce that we've created a shareable PDF checklist for the process that follows the death of a retiree. The checklist includes all the pertinent information about the required forms and supporting documents, along with important reminders. Gen. Livingston's message to the Middle School was inspiring. I hoped they listened.











SUBMARINER MEDAL OF HONOR RECIPIENTS

The submarine community has eight Medal of Honor recipients. Starting this month I will detail one awardee each month.

HENRY BREAULT TORPEDOMAN SECOND CLASS

- CONFLICT/ERA: INTERIM 1920 1940
- UNIT/COMMAND:U.S. SUBMARINE 0-5
- MILITARY SERVICE BRANCH: U.S. NAVY
- MEDAL OF HONOR ACTION DATE: OCTOBER 28, 1923
- MEDAL OF HONOR ACTION PLACE: LIMON BAY, CANAL ZONE, PANAMA

For heroism and devotion to duty while serving on board the U.S. submarine 0-5 at the time of the sinking of that vessel. On the morning of 28 October 1923, the 0-5 collided with the steamship Abangarez and sank in less than a minute. When the collision occurred, Breault was in the torpedo room. Upon reaching the hatch, he saw that the boat was rapidly sinking. Instead of jumping overboard to save his own life, he returned to the torpedo room to the rescue of a shipmate who he knew was trapped in the boat, closing the torpedo room hatch on himself. Breault and Brown remained trapped in this compartment until rescued by the salvage party 31 hours later.


Happy December!

What's going on in politics?

Brandon L. Cox, Berkeley County State Representative, introduced HR 3115 in 2022 and is expected to reach a vote this year. Currently South Carolina provides a tax credit for VA disability ratings at 100%. This bill when, when passed, will allow all VA benefits to be extended to all disability ratings.

SECTION 1. Article 25, Chapter 6, Title 12 of the S.C. Code is amended by adding:

Section 12-6-3810. A veteran who has a disability rating issued by the United States Department of Veteran Affairs is allowed a nonrefundable income tax credit equal to the product of his disability rating percent and his income tax liability. However, the amount of the credit may not exceed five thousand dollars each year. The department may require documentation that it considers necessary to administer the credit

 - USS GROWLER (SS-215) November 8, 1944 12th War Patrol Lost with all hands 86 souls
 - USS SCAMP (SS-277) November 16, 1944 8th War Patrol Lost with all hands 83 souls
 - USS CORVINA (SS-226) November 16, 1943 1st War Patrol Lost with all hands 82 souls
 - USS SCULPIN (SS-191) November 19, 1943 9th War Patrol Lost with 43 souls 41
 - became POWs 21 survived the war
 - 5 Boats and 399 Men Lost

- Steve Jones spoke about the Ralph Johnson Medical Center and the Medal of Honor Hallway at Stratford HS. After putting up 80 posters of men who had received this award (many posthumously), he contacted the Medal of Honor Society. General Livingston agreed to hold a dedication ceremony at Stratford in 2022. Steve Jones is currently teaching SC History at Sangaree Middle School. General Livingston has agreed to come speak to the children at that school. The event will be January 19, 2024 at 1000. All Charleston Base members were invited to attend as a guest of Steve Jones and the Principal of Sangaree Middle School.

 The Minutes from the October Base Meeting were emailed directly to the entire Base membership and, published on the Base Website. There were no revisions. The October Base Meeting Minutes were approved as written.

Treasurer – Ricky Collins:

• The Treasurer's Report for October was published and promulgated on the website. There were no revisions. The report was approved as presented.

Honorary Member:

 We are thankful to have Casey Power in attendance from Atlanta this evening.

Chaplain - Nick Nichols:

- Highlighted boat of the month:
 - USS CORVINA SS-226 was lost on November 16, 1943 with loss of 82 men when she was sunk just south of Truk. After topping off with fuel at Johnston Island, she left and was never heard from again. Corvina was on her 1st war patrol and appears she was lost to the torpedoes of a Japanese submarine.

There are several shipmates and family members who have given me information which they wish to be kept confidential at this time.

- Erica Ciesielko, 34, daughter of Mike & Dawn, passed away on Friday, 20 October, at home. A memorial service was held for her at the FRA on Saturday, 4 Nov. There were 13 SUBVETS and 9 wives in attendance.
- **Rick Sparger** went to SMC on Oct. 5th and diagnosed with sepsis on his kidney. He got home on the 16th and was feeling much better. He was taking IV through a PICC. On Saturday morning Oct 28th, Kit found him on the floor passed away. The memorial service was held on Sunday, Nov 5th at 1400 at Parks Funeral Home in Summerville. Burial was private. There were 61 SUBVETS, 21 wives, 12 FRA members along with 10 active-duty Sailors from NNPTC. There was standing room only. Rick had a Page 2 on file.
- Francis Shepherd, 94, Fred Woodley's brother-in-law, passed away in Michigan on Tuesday 31 Oct. Francis was a Korean War Veteran.
- Margaret Rogers, wife of Linn Rogers (EP:2020), passed away on Nov. 6th.
- Barbara Lisle, wife of George Lisle (EP:2009), passed away on Nov. 5th.
- James Graham Sr. had surgery this morning to remove the plates that were
 put in his foot during the earlier foot surgery

- Tom Clark had a biopsy for a spot on his kidney. The main cancer is aggressive Type B lymphoma growing around T8 and T9. Too much intermingled with T8 and T9 and spinal cord to consider surgery chemo only. Had first round of chemo yesterday and feels really weak. Fortunately, as a designated "old fart" the chemo mix was toned down to account for age and is expected to work for him. Getting a "port" installed on the 27th, then chemo every three weeks and rescan for a while. A kidney looks to be involved too, at this point waiting to see how that responds to the chemo as well. Prospects are good! Interesting side note the steroid reduces pain and cancer, but causes hiccups. Big internal feel in your tummy. Solution? Eat Peanut Butter and they greatly lessen. Whoda thunk?
- John Furst has developed a Pancreatic Divisum and santorinicele which is cystic dilatation of a duct in the pancreas. This was caused by an undiagnosed birth defect. Arthroscopic surgery was used to install a Stent and remove the cyst. Two months later, they had to remove the Stent. That was last year. In January of this year, he suffered a stroke which affected the left eye. He could not see clearly for a couple of days and his right eye would not move for a few days. His vision has since returned to normal. He has lost at least 50% of his strength on his left side and is going to physical therapy to help regain strength and balance. He is now having the same Pancreatic problem that he suffered last year. The doctor said that it may return. Waiting to get an appointment.
- Rick & Colleen Collins are the proud grandparents of Amelia Grace Moser, 8 lbs 2 oz born Sunday Oct 8, 2023. Parents are Geoff & Sarah Moser. Sarah is Rick's daughter. After spending some extra time in the hospital, Sarah and baby Ameilia are both home and doing well.
- Marvin Miller was hospitalized for a broken Hip socket Sept. 17th. Surgery was successful. He is now at Presbyterian Villages of Summerville Rm R5 for rehab. His phone number is 843-594-0170 He is doing better. Went to the doctor this past Tuesday and he was able to maneuver from his wheel-chair to the table for his scan by himself. He couldn't have done that two weeks ago. Scan was good and the wound is healing nicely. He is having some intestinal problems but is hoping he can get his strength up to where he can go home soon.
