#### USS Tullibee (SS 284)


The following story of Tullibee's loss is taken from a statement made by the lone survivor, C.W. Kuykendall, GM2c. He reports that the boat arrived on station, 25 March, and on the night of 26 March a radar contact was found to be on a convoy consisting of a large troop and cargo ship, two medium sized freighters, two escort vessels and a large destroyer.

Having solved the convoy's speed and course, Tullibee made several surface runs on the large transport, but held fire, being unable to see her due to squally weather. The escorts had detected the submarine's presence, and dropped 15 to 20 depth charges. The submarine came in to 3,000 yards, still unable to see the target, and fired two bow tubes. A minute or two later a terrific concussion shook the boat, and Kuykendall, who had been on the bridge, soon found himself struggling in the water. Since range and bearing of escorts was known, the survivor states that he is sure the explosion was the result of a circular run of one of Tullibee's torpedoes.

#### USS Tullibee (SS 284)

There were shouting men in the water when Kuykendall first regained consciousness after the blast, but after about ten minutes everything was silent, and he never again saw or heard any of the other Tullibee men. At 1000 on 27 March, an escort vessel located the swimming man, and after firing on him with machine guns, came in and picked him up. He learned here that the transport they had fired at had sunk.

The story of his captivity is much the same as the stories of survivors of Grenadier, Sculpin, Tang, Perch, and other U.S. submarines. He was questioned assiduously by English speaking officers, and beaten when he refused to give any more information than international law required. In April 1944, he was taken to Ofuna Naval Interrogation Camp, where he stayed until 30 September. From that date until rescue on 4 September 1945, he was forced to work in the copper mines of Ashio.

#### SUBMARINER MEDAL OF HONOR RECIPIENTS

The submarine community has eight Medal of Honor recipients. This is the second of eight in this series.

#### **CAPTAIN JOHN PHILIP CROMWELL**

- RANK: CAPTAIN
- CONFLICT/ERA: WORLD WAR II
- UNIT/COMMAND:U.S.S. SCULPIN
- MILITARY SERVICE BRANCH: U.S. NAVY
- MEDAL OF HONOR ACTION DATE: NOVEMBER 19, 1943
- MEDAL OF HONOR ACTION PLACE: OFF TRUK ISLAND, OFF TRUK ISLAND, SOUTH PACIFIC

As commander of a submarine coordinated attack group with flag in the U.S.S. Sculpin, during the 9th war patrol of that vessel in enemy-controlled waters off Truk Island, 19 November 1943. Undertaking this patrol prior to the launching of our first large-scale offensive in the Pacific, Capt. Cromwell, alone of the entire Task Group, possessed secret intelligence information of our submarine strategy and tactics, scheduled Fleet movements, and specific attack plans. Constantly vigilant and precise in carrying out his secret orders, he moved his undersea flotilla inexorably forward despite savage opposition and established a line of submarines to southeastward of the main Japanese stronghold at Truk. Cool and undaunted as the submarine, rocked and battered by Japanese depth charges, sustained terrific battle damage and sank to an excessive depth, he authorized the Sculpin to surface and engage the enemy in a gunfight, thereby providing an opportunity for the crew to abandon ship. Determined to sacrifice himself rather than risk capture and subsequent danger of revealing plans under Japanese torture or use of drugs, he stoically remained aboard the mortally wounded vessel as she plunged to her death, preserving the security of his mission, at the cost of his own life.

#### Automatic Content Tracking You are not just watching your Smart TV Your Smart TV is watching you

If you bought a new smart TV during any of the holiday sales, there's likely to be an uninvited guest watching along with you. The most popular smart TVs sold today use automatic content recognition (ACR), a kind of ad surveillance technology that collects data on everything you view and sends it to a proprietary database to identify what you're watching and serve you highly targeted ads. The software is largely hidden from view, and it's complicated to opt out. Many consumers aren't aware of ACR, let alone that it's active on their shiny new TVs. If that's you, and you'd like to turn it off,

First, a quick primer on the tech: ACR identifies what's displayed on your television, including content served through a cable TV box, streaming service, or game console, by continuously grabbing screenshots and comparing them to a massive database of media and advertisements. Think of it as a Shazam-like service constantly running in the background while your TV is on.

These TVs can capture and identify 7,200 images per hour, or approximately two every second. The data is then used for content recommendations and ad targeting, which is a huge business; advertisers spent an estimated \$18.6 billion on smart TV ads in 2022, according to market research firm eMarketer.

For anyone who'd rather not have ACR looking over their shoulder while they watch, we've put together a guide to turning it off on three of the most popular smart TV software platforms in use last year. Depending on the platform, turning off ACR took us between 10 and 37 clicks.

#### USS Triton (SSRN-586) First Submerged Circumnavigation by any Vessel

USS Triton (SSR(N)-586) was commissioned on 10 November 1959 in Groton, Connecticut, with Captain Edward L. Beach in command. On her maiden cruise, the submarine departed on 15 February 1960 bound for the South Atlantic arriving in the Middle Atlantic off St. Peter and St. Paul Rocks on 24 February. Remaining submerged, Triton departed from her position, continued south towards Cape Horn, rounded the tip of South America, and then travelled west across the Pacific. After passing through the Philippine and Indonesian archipelagoes and crossing the Indian Ocean, she rounded the Cape of Good Hope and arrived off St. Peter and St. Paul Rocks—the starting point of the historic journey—on 10 April 60 days and 21 hours after departing the landmark. Triton arrived back at Groton on 10 May completing the first submerged circumnavigation of the Earth.

Some highlights of the bill:

- \$883 billion for all defense related activities
- \$28 billion more than 2023, a 3.2% increase
- \$841 billion for the DOD
- Total active duty strength at 1,283,700
  - 337,000 for the Navy

- No new Tricare fee increases were in the 2024 National Defense Bill


#### Only Remaining Vietnam Veteran in the Senate to Retire

#### Chaplain – Nick Nichols:

- Highlighted boat of the month:
  - USS S-36 SS-141 was lost on January 20, 1942 with no loss of life, on her 2nd war patrol. She ran hard aground on the Taka Bakang Reef in Makassar Strait, Indonesia and radioed for help. The entire crew was rescued by a Dutch ship after they scuttled her

There are several shipmates and family members who have given me information which they wish to be kept confidential at this time.

- Wayne Standerfer has been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. He is the USSVI Immediate Past National Commander. Cancer. Wayne is undergoing tests and will see the oncologist after the tests are completed. The prognosis of those test results will determine the possible treatment options and course of action. Please keep Wayne and his family in your thoughts and prayers.
- Jerry Stout reported his cancer (Merckle cell Carcinoma skin cancer) has reappeared in my left neck and clavicle after 9 months of clear margins. He had focused radiation centered at the affected area but ss this procedure is not a cure; he will be staying on an immune regiment until it appears again. Thank you for your thoughts and prayers.

- **Tom Clark** has an aggressive Type B lymphoma growing on his spine. His latest email to me: Got PET Scan today, Jan. 9<sup>th</sup>, and it shows no evidence of the cancer it showed six weeks ago. Still have 2 more chemo sessions just because they cannot see in the scan it does not mean it is not there in smaller amounts. Likely the "symptoms" I've experienced are due to the chemo and other meds. So, I'll still be "wobbly" for several months . . . . a small price to be shed of cancer. I know all the prayers that were raised for me are a significant part of getting to this point thank you all.
- Mike Emerson had surgery on Dec 21 and is doing well.
- **Sonny Rash** is having lung surgery at the VA on Jan 25. Expects to be in the hospital 2-4 days and then a 2–4-week recovery. He told me he already told the doctor he would cut each of those time limits in half.
- John Furst is suffering from pancreatitis which happened after he had the stents put in his pancreas. He's also recovering from a stroke he had last year that left him weak on his left side.
- Marvin Miller was hospitalized in September 2023 for a broken Hip socket. Surgery was successful. He was at Presbyterian Villages of Summerville until early Dec 2023. He was discharged to home and became sick. Diagnosed with Cdiff. Spent a week in Summerville Medical and is now back in the Villages. Freida said she expects him home sometime the week of Jan 8<sup>th</sup>.
